Online modules open at 4 p.m. on the start date. This is the earliest that students can access their course work. During a module, online submissions are due before 4 p.m. each Thursday. Deadlines are **strictly** enforced, unless prior approval in writing has been granted.

Students can complete the Trust Accounting self-study course at any time during the CPLD year. To avoid delaying their bar admission, students must obtain a certificate of completion by **March 31, 2017**.

* Students must arrange to have an invigilator oversee their Practice Management and Client Relationship Management Competency Evaluations.

Note:

The registration deadline is **May 31, 2016**. Students who do not apply by this date are subject to a non-refundable late filing fee.

Documentation and fees are due **July 29, 2016**. Students whose documentation and fees are not received by this date may have their applications cancelled and/or be delayed entry into the CPLD Program.
